In a severely infected plant the foliage can be covered in orange pustules followed by severe browning of the leaves. This rust has been found on daylilies throughout the country. Although NCDC makes every effort to provide the healthiest daylilies from our gardens, or as club plants, it does not, and cannot warrantee or guarantee that daylilies being sold, auctioned or placed in gardens, are rust free.

## Participate in NCDC's Club Plant Program Application Due November 23

It's a slow time of year for daylilies, but our Club Plant Chair Faith Bange is already thinking about new daylilies for our gardens. Soon, NCDC will purchase new introductions and unusual daylilies for our Club Plant Program. We loan these plants to hard-working members as a way to learn which daylilies perform best in our Mid-Atlantic gardens. About 20 daylilies are distributed annually. Members grow them for two (2) years, then they are auctioned in August and the funds go to support the program.

The Club Plant program is designed to provide members with the opportunity to see and grow some of the newer and more expensive daylily cultivars. This promotes goodwill and encourages participation in club activities. Members who actively participate in NCDC events, donate plants to sales, or work on committees are eligible to receive a Club Plant. If your garden is featured on the NCDC annual Garden Tour, you will have priority for a Club Plant.

### How the Program Works

You grow the plant for in your garden for two (2) years. After that time it is anticipated that the single (or double fan) will increase into a nice clump. You are entitled to keep a single fan of the plant for your own enjoyment and return the rest to the Club Auction held in August.

To apply for a Club Plant, you must complete a Club Plant Application Form (see insert). Please list the names of the **cultivar** and **hybridizer** of any daylily that you are especially interested in growing and we will make an effort to obtain them. If you are selected to receive a Club Plant we will let you know when to expect your plant. Like other daylilies, Club Plants may suffer the ill effects of weather, shipping, or

infestations, so losses may occur. Keep the Club Plant Chair informed.

If your plant is a slow increaser, you may be asked to grow the plant for an additional year. If it increases rapidly, you may be asked to bring the plant to auction a year early. Please inform the Club Plant Chair in either case.

### Club Plant Recipients' Responsibilities

- Club Plants should be well grown. It is expected that plants be planted in the ground, in good soil, fertilized and weeded to ensure optimum growth and performance.
- Labels will be provided which indicate the name of the cultivar and the notation "Club Plant"
- Club Plants should be available for viewing by other NCDC members
- You may use Club Plant pollen for hybridizing but NO PODS SHOULD BE SET. Bee crosses should be removed.
- Enter or display your Club Plant at the daylily show
- Report the status of your Club Plant to the Chair annually (assessment form will be provided)
- Provide a color photo of your Club Plant for display at the Club Plant auction
- Return all but one (1) fan of your Club Plant, (**properly** divided, groomed, and labeled) to the auction on schedule
- Return your entire Club Plant should you resign from NCDC or move out of the area

In order to obtain the desired cultivars before they are sold out advise the Club Plant Chair of your suggestions before November 23 along with your completed Club Application form.
